## PROGRAMME OUTCOMES (POs)

## B.A. Sanskrit 1+1+1 General <br> Department Of Sanskrit

POs are statements about what the students should know, be able to do, and think by the end of the plan (for example, a three-year B.A. graduation course). POs look at the big picture of a program's graduation and the skills and information that a graduate will have after the course is over.

1. This Programme will help students to acquire a general understanding of Classical Sanskrit literature, philosophy, history, religion, and culture through Sanskrit texts.
2. Students will acquire advanced knowledge of Sanskrit. As a result, they will carry an advanced efficiency to read, write and understand Sanskrit texts independently.
3. This programme would enable the students to enhance the ability of academic writing and oral presentation skills about ancient Indian literature, religion, history, and culture through Sanskrit and Oriental texts.
4. After the completition of this programme students would have the relevant generic skills and professional competencies that are required to understand the ancient medicine system (Ayurveda), health science like Yogā, etc.
5. Students would have the expertise to interpret the śāstras to establish their relevance to contemporary intellectual explorations and solutions to practical problems.
6. Students will understand and show Sanskrit's uniting role in Indian nationalism.
7. Through a few verses from Bhāravi's Kirātārjunīyaṃ and Nītiśatakaṃ of Vartṛhari, the course is meant to teach students about morality and ethics. The study of Sanskrit texts would enable the students to build up their character and inculcation of social, moral, and spiritual values and thus their personality could be developed.
8. The main goal of the three-year graduation study in Sanskrit is to show Indian students the most important parts of their cultural heritage that are written down in Sanskrit texts.
